1. Before choosing a hosting path

- 04 Who receives renewal and billing notices?
- 05 Where are backups stored and how are they restored?
- 06 What credentials and documentation must be handed off?

2. Match the workload to a DotMoose path

cPanel hosting A familiar control plane for conventional client websites.

WordPress hosting A focused path for WordPress projects.

VPS Custom applications or sites needing server-level control.

Migrations Files, databases, DNS, certificates, email dependencies, and rollback.
