1. Before choosing a hosting path

Write the answers down. If nobody can answer these, that is the first infrastructure problem to solve.

01 Identify checkout, payment, database, email, and DNS dependencies.

02 Confirm backups are independent and restorable.

03 Document traffic patterns and known peak periods.

04 Plan migrations around order flow and rollback requirements.

05 Track resource pressure before the store becomes slow.

06 Define when VPS or dedicated hosting becomes necessary.

2. Match the workload to a DotMoose path

WordPress hosting For WordPress and WooCommerce stores that fit a managed web environment.

VPS For stores needing server-level configuration and isolated resources.

Dedicated For sustained higher demand or physical-server requirements.

Backups A recovery layer independent from the live store.
