1. Before choosing a hosting path

Write the answers down. If nobody can answer these, that is the first infrastructure problem to solve.

- 01 Use a standard checklist for every new client.
- 02 Record domain ownership and renewal responsibility.
- 03 Choose the simplest suitable hosting model.
- 04 Keep a backup copy outside the live site.
- 05 Document handoff expectations before the project ends.
- 06 Give larger projects a clear VPS or dedicated upgrade path.
