1. Before choosing a hosting path

Write the answers down. If nobody can answer these, that is the first infrastructure problem to solve.

- 01 Separate prototype assumptions from production requirements.
- 02 Document services, ports, databases, workers, and scheduled jobs.
- 03 Keep recovery copies outside the production server.
- 04 Define monitoring for CPU, memory, storage, and service health.
- 05 Record DNS, certificates, secrets, and deployment dependencies.
- 06 Set a measurable threshold for scaling up or moving to dedicated hardware.

2. Match the workload to a DotMoose path

VPS A controlled starting point for apps, workers, and databases.

Dedicated A later path for sustained demand or physical isolation.

Backups Recovery independent from the production server.

Domains Customer-facing and supporting service domains.

Turn the checklist into a real hosting plan.
